CIL SPENDING REVIEW – JUNE 2020

Introduction

Thurston Parish Council receives a sum of money from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding from developments within the Parish. 15% or 25% (if the application is approved after 24th October 2020 as this is when the Thurston Neighbourhood Plan was made) of the total CIL collected by Mid Suffolk for each commenced development in Thurston is passed to the parish council where the development is located, once the monies have been collected by Mid Suffolk District Council. Monies are paid twice a year – April and October.

The Parish Infrastructure and Investment Steering Group was set-up by the Parish Council to identify projects for funding. This group was made up of Parish Councillors and members of the Thurston Neighbourhood Plan Sub-Committee. This report is provided to the Parish Council to understand this additional funding stream and how it may be used to fund the infrastructure needed from further development within the parish.

Currently there are a number of vacancies on this group with membership now consisting of 3 Parish Councillors and 1 Member of the Neighbourhood Plan Sub-Committee. At the meeting of 5th February 2020, the Parish Council agreed to disband this group until the Council was at full complement and that all reporting to / decision making would be by full Council.

1. CIL - Spending the Levy

What can the Community Infrastructure Levy be spent on (and by whom)?

The levy can be used to fund a wide range of infrastructure, including transport, flood defences, schools, hospitals, and other health and social care facilities (for further details, see section 216(2) of the Planning Act 2008, and regulation 59, as amended by the 2012 and 2013 Regulations).

This definition allows the levy to be used to fund a very broad range of facilities such as play areas, parks and green spaces, cultural and sports facilities, academies and free schools, district heating schemes and police stations and other community safety facilities. Charging authorities may not use the levy to fund affordable housing.

Local authorities must spend the levy on infrastructure needed to support the development of their area, and they are able to decide what infrastructure is needed. The levy is intended to focus on the provision of new infrastructure and should not be used to remedy pre-existing deficiencies in infrastructure provision unless those deficiencies will be made more severe by new development.

The levy can be used to increase the capacity of existing infrastructure or to repair failing existing infrastructure, if that is necessary to support development.

Up to 5% of the total CIL income received by Mid Suffolk District Council (MSDC) will be spent on the cost of administering CIL and the remainder will be spent on infrastructure anywhere within the districts or outside the districts if to do so would support development within the districts.

2. CIL Framework Updates

In April 2020, MSDC announced some important changes to the CIL Expenditure Framework and the CIL Expenditure Communication Strategy and produced a statement on the position on Community Infrastructure Levy Income and Expenditure (CIL) April 2020 – Corona virus:

"The Corona virus is presenting challenges which are being experienced in the delivery of housing on large and small sites by the Districts housebuilders. Part of this house building process involves the collection and expenditure of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) towards the delivery of infrastructure. Whilst Babergh and Mid Suffolk wish to support our housebuilders it is important to recognise that housing growth affects communities. As such a balance must be struck between providing assistance towards housing delivery whilst at the same time needing to safeguard our communities by ensuring that CIL monies are both collected and spent to deliver necessary infrastructure. On this basis the following position has been taken across both Districts regarding the collection and expenditure of CIL which will apply until the 30th June 2020 whereupon this position will be reviewed."

CIL COLLECTION - All other legislative provisions relating to the collection of CIL remain in force and must be complied with.

3. CIL CAP

Neighbourhood CIL is governed by the CIL Regulations and the rate at which it is paid is set out in national legislation. For those Parish Councils with a made Neighbourhood Plan it is 25% (with no CAP) and for Parishes where is no made Neighbourhood Plan it is 15% subject to a cap which is set out nationally (in legislation) - see below:-

The Cap -

* 25% of Neighbourhood CIL is paid where permissions are granted on or after the Neighbourhood Plan is made.

15% Neighbourhood CIL is paid where a Neighbourhood Plan is not made. There is a financial cap which relates to the total amount of the 15% Neighbourhood CIL receipts passed to a parish council. Any payment must not exceed an amount equal to £100 per council tax dwelling in that parish in each financial year.

This financial cap does not apply in Parishes where a Neighbourhood Plan is made.

The Professional Lead – Key Sites and Infrastructure at MSDC has stated that MSDC holds CIL monies and under the CIL Expenditure Framework, any under payment to the parish (due to the CAP) is then split between the 80% Local Infrastructure Fund and 20% Strategic Infrastructure Fund. If the payments relate to 10 dwellings and above, then the 80% is ringfenced in the Ringfenced Fund for spend within that Parish. In the respect of Thurston Parish it is confirmed that 80% of the funds which could not be paid to the Parish because of the CAP have been ringfenced for spend within the parish on CIL Bids which the District receives and determines.

Resources available as at 31st May 2020 in the CIL Reserve account is £168,480.03. Committed expenditure for 2020-2021 as at 31st May 2020 is circa £35,000
