## CIL SPENDING REVIEW – October 2023 for the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024

Neighbourhood CIL is governed by the CIL Regulations and the rate at which it is paid is set out in national legislation. For those Parish Councils with a made Neighbourhood Plan it is 25% (with no CAP) and for Parishes where is no made Neighbourhood Plan it is 15% subject to a cap which is set out nationally (in legislation).

The cap is worked out at £100 index linked per occupied property within the parish. The cap rate is set for the year and changes on the 1<sup>st</sup> January each year. Thurston's NDP was adopted on the 24<sup>th</sup> October 2019. Any planning permission granted before that date will attract the 15% capped figure, anything granted after that date will attract the 25% uncapped figure.
